## Repaso rápido: Informal and formal subject pronouns

In Spanish you should use the informal tu when talking to someone you refer to by a first name. Use the more formal usted (abbreviated Ud.) with an adult you don't know well or when speaking with someone you would address using a title such as  $se\~nor$ ,  $se\~nora$  or  $se\~norita$ . In most Spanish-speaking countries the plural ustedes (abbreviated Uds.) is used when talking formally or informally to two or more people. However, in Spain people distinguish between the formal ustedes and the informal ustedes and the informal ustedes which is used when speaking with two or more friends.

## Repaso rápido: Subject pronouns and the verb ser

Remember that the verb ser is one of two Spanish verbs that mean to be.

yo	soy	I am	nosotros/nosotras	somos	we are
tú	eres	you are	vosotros/vosotras	sois	you are
Ud. él ella	es	you are he (it) is she (it) is	Uds. ellos ellas	son	you are they are they are

The verb ser has several different uses. For example, we use it to express origin and profession:

¿De dónde eres tú? Where are you from? Soy de California. I am from California. Enrique es profesor. Enrique is a teacher.
